Most doctors are of the opinion to reduce screen time for small babies. Screen time includes time spent on TV, videos, laptops, phones etc. American Academy of Paediatrics (AAP) has made a clear stance of "NO screen time for kids less than 2 years", the main reason being that language learning delays, poor reading skills and poor short term memory are seen more often in children with more screen time.

Children learn better from real life experiences rather than screen time, especially if activities involve moving and doing. A child's first two years are very critical for learning of new concepts including 3 dimensional Sensory-Motor experiences which cannot be replicated on a 2 dimensional screen.
